Bill: Title: Sponsor: House: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 138 relative to rules pertaining to marine species managed under the Magnusson-Stevens fishery conservation and management act. Rep. James Webb Adopted on 02/14/2019. Senate Executive Departments and Administration Schedule pending. Supporters argued that this bill would allow Fish and Game to more efficiently comply with new federal laws.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: House: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 196 relative to proof of residency for fish and game purposes. Rep. James Spillane Adopted with Amendment on 02/27/2019. Senate Executive Departments and Administration Adopted by the Senate with Amendment on 04/11/2019. Language seeks to mirror requirements from DMV for obtaining a driver's license. Amendment make some technical language changes to better address the intent of the bill.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status:	HB 281 (new title) relative to flow devices designed to control beaver damming and minimize the risk of flooding behind an existing beaver dam. Rep. Mel Myler Senate Energy and Natural Resources Schedule pending.

Comments:	Bill was well received by Senate Committee. Executive Session likely in the next few weeks.

Senate Energy and Natural Resources Public Hearing: 04/23/2019, Room 103, SH, 09:30 am Concerns raised at the hearing by Fish and Game about the cost of equipment and the possible misuse or vandalism of equipment.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: House: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 591 amending the laws governing OHRVs and snowmobiles. Rep. Wayne Moynihan Adopted by the House with Amendment on 03/20/2019. Senate Transportation Schedule pending. Original bill was a request of Fish and Game. Amendment is exceedingly problematic as it would make the process for towns to allow use of Class V roads for OHRVs very burdensome.

Legislation Regarding Firearms

Bill: Title: Sponsor: House: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 109 requiring background checks for commercial firearms sales. Rep. Katherine Rogers Adopted by the House on 03/19/2019 Senate Judiciary Schedule pending. Extended debate, with supporters saying that even if it is just a feel good measure, the committee needs to do something. Opponents said the state does not have a gun violence problem and the bill does nothing to stop criminals.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: House: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 514 imposing a waiting period between the purchase and delivery of a firearm. Rep. Katherine Rogers Adopted by the House on 3/19/2019 Senate Judiciary Schedule pending. Vote was along party line. Bill will be heavily debated.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: House: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 564 relative to possession of firearms in safe school zones. Rep. Mary Heath Adopted by the House on 04/04/2019 Senate Judiciary Schedule pending Language clarifies exemption for individuals with firearms in cars that are on campus picking students up from school.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 696 establishing a protective order for vulnerable adults. Rep. Robert Renny Cushing House Criminal Justice and Public Safety Adopted by the House on 04/04/2019. Concerns raised surrounding possible constitutional conflicts and 2A infringements. Supporters argued that the language was lifted directly out of the domestic violence statutes.

Linda Gould House Finance (2 nd Committee) Retained in Committee on 03/27/2019. Committee will include a smaller appropriation as a possible budget amendment.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 501 establishing a cost of care fund to assist municipalities caring for animals during animal cruelty cases. Rep. John O'Connor House Environment and Agriculture Retained in Committee on 02/19/19. Committee retained bill to possibly place language into another related bill.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 640 establishing a registration fee for canoes and kayaks. Rep. Jeffrey Goley House Fish and Game and Marine Resources Retained in Committee on 02/13/19. Committee hopes to find some compromise over the summer and create a voluntary program for users of canoes and kayaks.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 683 relative to the rights of property owners abutting certain highways and railtrails. Rep. Wayne Moynihan House Resources, Recreation and Development Retained in Committee on 03/13/2019. Committee felt that there were many possible unintended consequences and more time is needed to see if compromise is possible.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 687 relative to extreme risk protection orders. Rep. Debra Altschiller House Criminal Justice and Public Safety Retained in Committee on 03/14/2019. Would establish a red flag law that would allow for an extreme risk protection order to be granted on an individual after a petitioner proves that there is clear and convincing evidence that the person poses a significant risk of causing bodily injury to himself, herself or others by having firearms and ammunition in their custody.

2019 Killed Bills

Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	 CACR 3 relating to hunters' rights. providing that citizens of the state have the right to hunt subject to laws promoting sound wildlife conservation and management. Rep. Robert Forsythe House Fish and Game and Marine Resources Killed by the House on 02/27/2019. Was not received well by committee. Many concerns raised by Fish and Game as well as by the committee members on implementation and conflicts with current state law. Committee was not sure whether or not this was needed.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 101 relative to regulating possession of firearms in a school district. Rep. Jacqueline Cali-Pitts House Education Tabled on 02/28/2019. Bill was tabled by the House. Committee voted ITL by 14-5. The committee felt the bill had the possibility of too many unintended consequences. A motion to Retain failed 9-10.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 108 relative to the number of days per year a charitable organization may offer bingo. Rep. Timothy Lang House Executive Departments and Administration Killed by the House on 01/31/2019. Legislation seeks to increase the number of charitable bingo games allowed per month from 10 to 16 with a cap of 120 in any calendar year.
Bill: Title:	HB 276 <i>permitting swimming at a fish and game department cartop boat launch access area.</i>

Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	Rep. Ed Comeau House Fish and Game and Marine Resources Killed by the House on 02/27/2019. Supported by one individual that has had an issue on Connor Pond in Ossipee. Fish and Game concerned that they will lose federal matching funds if they allow swimming at these launches.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 282 relative to the authority of fish and game officers to search without a warrant. Rep. James Spillane House Criminal Justice and Public Safety Killed by the House on 01/31/2019. Opposed by sportsman's groups and the Fish and Game department. Would have severely limited the ability of conservation officers to do their jobs.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 316 relative to the law governing training permits for the training of bird dogs and trail or tree hounds. Rep. Josh Yokela House Fish and Game and Marine Resources Killed by the House on 02/14/2019. Body felt that there were too many unintended consequences to move the bill forward.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 322 relative to reporting the taking of a turkey. Rep. James Spillane House Fish and Game and Marine Resources Killed by the House on 02/14/2019. Concerns were raised about the impact of losing much of the data that is collected on the health of the turkey population. Fish and Game also concerned about the lack of funding for the program.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 439 relative to unauthorized occupation of land or structures. Rep. Werner Horn House Criminal Justice and Public Safety Killed by the House on 01/31/2019. Concerns raised about too many unintended consequences.
Bill: Title: Sponsor:	HB 442 <i>relative to coyote hunting.</i> Rep. Ellen Read

Committee:	House Fish and Game and Marine Resources
Status:	Killed by the House on 03/20/2019.
Comments:	Majority of committee believed that any decisions on hunting seasons should be left to the experts at fish and game.

Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 498 prohibiting OHRV operation on class v ways. Rep. Wayne Moynihan House Transportation Killed by the House on 03/20/2019. Majority of the committee agreed that removing OHRVs from the roads would have a detrimental impact on the economy of the north country.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 512 relative to dogs on hiking trails in state parks and state forests. Rep. Michael Harrington House Resources, Recreation and Development Killed by the House on 03/20/2019. Committee was not sure if this bill was necessary and believed there were too many unanswered questions to pass the bill at this time.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	 HB 516 relative to funding for pollution control equipment at the powder mill fish hatchery through the purchase of a trout/salmon stamp. Rep. Michael Harrington House Fish and Game and Marine Resources Killed by the House on 02/27/2019. Majority of the committee felt that creating a program to collect funds was premature being that the project has not been studied or developed at this time.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 580 relative to bonding construction projects for the department of natural and cultural resources. Rep. David Danielson House Public Works and Highways Killed by the House on 02/14/2019. It was felt that this is not needed at this time.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 679 authorizing the department of environmental services to lease land associated with state-owned impoundments. Rep. Henry Parkhurst House Public Works and Highways Killed by the House on 02/14/2019. Concurs were raised that this bill might have too many unintended consequences.

Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 699 relative to discounts for OHRV and snowmobile registration. Rep. James Spillane House Fish and Game and Marine Resources Killed by the House on 02/27/2019. Risk to the operation of clubs was too high to move forward currently.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Committee: Status: Comments:	HB 688 relative to transfer and inspection of animals. Rep. Peter Bixby House Environment and Agriculture Tabled by the House on 02/27/2019. Large amount of testimony in opposition to bills. Opposition argued that there is no need to pass legislation when you are only concerned about a small amount on irresponsible breeders.
Bill: Title: Sponsor: Senate: Committee: Status: Comments:	SB 234 <i>establishing the position of director of the office of outdoor recreation</i> <i>industry development in the department of business and economic affairs.</i> Sen. Jeb Bradley Adopted with Amendment on 03/14/2019. Senate Finance (2 nd Committee) Tabled by the Senate on 03/28/2019 Amendment clarifies technical concerns that were raised at the public hearing.
